WHEREAS, Various expansions of Kendra's Law should also be considered, including expanding the period of time from six months to a year that a court can order assisted outpatient treatment for an individual; requiring evaluations of mentally ill persons released from incarceration; and public outreach to ensure family members have more information regarding the options for care afforded by Kendra's Law; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body recognizes the value of Kendra's Law both to the person suffering from mental illness and the greater public and supports expansion of the law and making the law permanent; now, therefore, be it.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING STATE REVIEW OF POTENTIAL ABUSE OF MEDICAID-FUNDED AMBULANCE TRANSPORTS TO PROTECT TAXPAYERS AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body advocates for fiscal policies that protect the health, safety, quality of life and economic viability of those who live and work in Rensselaer County; and

WHEREAS, By order of the Federal Government and New York State, Rensselaer County is mandated to cover a percentage of expenses for programs including Medicaid, with costs for Medicaid in the County now approximately \$40 million annually; and

WHEREAS, These services include emergency ambulance transport for those receiving public assistance and coverage under Medicaid, and members of this Legislative Body have learned of abuses of this system; and

WHEREAS, Referred to as "chronic callers", certain persons receiving coverage under Medicaid and other public assistance are known to call for ambulance transport on numerous occasions for issues that are not lifethreatening or involve serious medical issues; and

WHEREAS, Members of this Legislative Body have learned from emergency responders of individuals who call dozens of times a year for non-emergencies, creating expense for County Taxpayers for expensive visits to emergency rooms and a drain on emergency services and personnel, along with maintenance of vehicles, equipment and fuel costs; and

WHEREAS, This information comes with recent reports of other residents receiving Medicaid-funded ambulance transports in other areas of the State, with one Buffalo-area resident receiving over 600 ambulance rides in one year at a cost of nearly \$120,000, and absent State action, this problem has continued to worsen; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body believes New York State should conduct a review of "chronic callers" to determine the extent of misuse of Medicaid-funded ambulance transports and provide greater discretion to counties and local governments concerning use of these services, and empower counties to take appropriate action to deal with this problem; and

WHEREAS, The fiscal year 2011 HRBRRD mandated the five counties to pay a like sum to that district; and

WHEREAS, The five counties commenced an administrative proceeding and then litigation to dispute the manner of HRBRRD's assessment; and

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2011, the Supreme Court of the State of New York rendered its decision against the five counties by stating that the procedure used by and basis of HRBRRD in making its assessment were reasonable; and

WHEREAS, The five counties then appealed from that decision and order to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court for the Third Department (Appellate Division); and

WHEREAS, The Appellate Division ruled on May 10, 2012 that although the assessment process was otherwise proper, HRBRRD must take subtract from its assessments the value of real property owned by the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, It is consistent with the duty of this Legislative Body to recognize the contributions of the citizens of Rensselaer County, we honor a man who devoted his life to serving his community and country; and

WHEREAS, Attendant to such concern and fully in accord with our longstanding traditions, it is the intent of this Legislative Body to convey its sincerest sympathy's upon the death of Cornelius "Neil" Gray, which occurred on the twenty-eighth day of December of the year Two thousand twelve; and

WHEREAS, Neil was the son of the late Cornelius W. and Irene Coffey Gray; and

WHEREAS, In 1942 Neil was a graduate of CBA in Albany and in 1950 he was a graduate of Siena College; he enrolled in Georgetown University for post graduate work; and

Neil enlisted in the United States Army in December 1942. He was assigned to duty in India in 1943. He was recruited by the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) and trained in jungle navigation, weapons, explosives, radio codes and evasion tactics. He parachuted behind enemy lines where he operated with the resistance forces in Burma until the end of World War II in 1945. In May of 1951 Neil was recalled to active duty with the United States Army for Korea. He was assigned to the Counter Intelligence Corp. at Ft. Holabird, Md. He was transferred to Japan as an intelligence agent and later to the 7th Infantry Division where he served until the end of hostilities in Korea. Neil attended various military schools and served as a special agent for counter intelligence mostly in civilian attire. His daughter Mary Jo was born in June of 1954 while he was assigned to the 108th Counter Intelligence Corps (CIC) in New Jersey. He continued to serve in classified intelligence assignments in the U.S., Far East and Europe until he was assigned to command an element of the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment in Vietnam. Neil retired as a United States Army Major; and

WHEREAS, After retirement he was employed by the Atomic Energy Commission and later by General Dynamics in the Navy's Nuclear Propulsion Program; and

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WHEREAS, Active in his community he was a charter member of the North Albany American Legion and was the 2nd Commander; and

WHEREAS, Neil received three Bronze Stars for valor in World War II, Korea and Vietnam, as well as numerous medals, commendations and citations and in 1998, he was inducted into the Air Commando's Hall of Fame in Ft. Walton Beach, Fla.; and

WHEREAS, Cornelius "Neil" Gray will be missed by his family: his wife of sixty-one years Cheryl; his daughter Mary Jo (dear friend Char); several nieces and nephews especially Bill (Betsy); lifelong friend of Mike (Katie). He was predeceased by his brother William; now, therefore, be it
